In the Semi Final Pasi Uotila defeated his countryman Mika Luoto 227-175, while Britt Bröndsted defeated Kirsten Penny from England 216-210.

Ballmaster Open was the first of seventeen stops in the European Bowling Tour 2004, why the two finalists came in as the leading player in the women's respectively the men's 2004 tour ranking.

Story 2004-02: Anders Öhman is back

The PBA career for Swedish Anders Öhman was short. Anders Öhman joined PBA in November 2003 and a confirming letter from the PBA Office in Seattle proves the resignation of Anders Öhman from PBA to be effective as of 31 December 2003.

We found Anders Öhman in Tali Bowling Stadium where he took part in the 1st stop in the European Bowling Tour 2004 - Ballmaster Open in Helsinki. On enquiry for the reason for the fast resignation Anders Öhman answered: The atmosphere and the life surrounding the PBA Tour are not for me.

Anders took a fast decision and he is now back in the more social, friendly and warm atmosphere in the European Bowling Tour and other major tournaments in Europe.

According to the World Tenpin Bowling Association Playing Rules the short termed membership of PBA anyhow will bring Anders Öhman out of international championships in 2004, meaning that he is prevented from participating in the World Ranking Masters in Russia, the European Cup Teams in England, the European Cup Individuals in Turkey and the World Tenpin Team Cup in The Netherlands.

Anders Öhman is the ruling champion of the World Ranking Masters and the European Cup Individuals; both won in 2003 where the number of Anders Öhman's successes was many and his achievements unique and impressive. But there will be no Anders Öhman to defend the WRM and the ECI titles in 2004.

Anders Öhman will be eligible for all championships again as of 1 January 2005 and since it includes the World Ranking Masters 2005, Anders Öhman can be awarded points in all EBT Stops in 2004.

Anders Öhman will - by his fast decision to resign from PBA - furthermore be able to defend his title as European Champion at the European Men Championships 2005 in Moscow.

We wish Anders Öhman a very warm welcome back at the European arena and good luck in the coming years.

Story 2004-03: Championship frequency

In 2004 the last European Cup Teams will be conducted in June (England) and the last World Tenpin Team Cup will be conducted in November (The Netherlands). The last European Youth Cup Teams was conducted in 2003.

At the World level it has been decided to split the World Championships in the Women's World Championships and the Men's World Championships, each of them conducted every second year as of 2005.

In Europe a similar decision has been taken, namely to conduct a Women's European Championships every second year and a Men's European Championships every second year. Furthermore the European Youth Championships will be conducted every year as of 2005. Previously it was every second year. The European Cup Individuals and the European Gold Cup will be conducted unchanged every year.

The consequence of the above decisions is a future championship sequence as follows.

Story 2004-08: Dual lane condition in the ECI

The ETBF Presidium at its recent meeting decided to use the dual lane condition concept (short oil and long oil) during the ECI 2004.

This means that the qualification will consist of 4 squads of 6 games each played on two lane conditions, i.e. the 1st squad on short oil; the 2nd squad on long oil; the 3rd squad on short oil; and the 4th squad on long oil.

In the Top 8 Single Elimination the top seed of each match chooses which condition to start on. For example if the choice is to start on short oil and the match goes over 3 games, then the bowlers play on short oil - long oil - short oil.

Story 2004-11: EBT 2005

The interest of the European Bowling Tour is growing and the number of tournaments adopted in the European Bowling Tour is growing.

As a consequence the ETBF Presidium has decided to introduce a new tour concept as of the European Bowling Tour 2005, where two categories of tournaments - EBT Majors and EBT Tournaments - will be adopted in the tour.

The Entry value (as referred to in the following) is defined as the total prize money of the individual and international part of a tournament divided by the maximum entry fee of the tournament.

Criteria for an EBT Major

The total prize money of the international part of the tournament must not be less than \in 40.000.

The Entry Value must not be less than 275.

The tournament must have been accepted in the previous EBT.

A maximum of two EBT Majors from each member federation is allowed.

An EBT Major cannot clash with another EBT Major.

An EBT Major cannot clash with the World Championships, the World Ranking Masters or the European Championships.

Double points according to a changed top 50 points table as presented below.

There will be a fixed EBT fee of € 3.000 to be pre-paid to ETBF.

Criteria for an EBT Tournament

The total prize money of the international part of the tournament must not be less than € 25.000.

The Entry Value must not be less than 175.

A maximum of three EBT Tournaments from each federation is allowed, unless an EBT Majors is accepted from the federation as well, in which case the number of EBT Tournaments will be reduced.

An EBT Tournament can clash with another EBT Tournament and with an EBT Major.

An EBT Tournament cannot clash with the World Championships, the World Ranking Masters or the European Championships.

Points according to a changed top 50 points table as presented below.

There will be a fixed EBT fee of \in 2.000 to be pre-paid to ETBF.

Besides introducing two categories of tournaments in the tour the total number of stops per country is enlarged from 2 to 3 and furthermore two or more stops might be conducted in the same period, though not more than on EBT Major.

From a European point of view it means that top bowlers like Paulina Aalto, Mika Koivuniemi, Jouni Helminen, Sami Konsteri and Tore Torgersen can participate in the European Bowling Tour at the same conditions as all other European bowlers.

With the conclusion of the Brunswick Euro Challenge - conducted in Thessalonica, Greece 8-14 March 2004 - a new great and important tournament in Europe is born.

The tournament was hosted in a co-operation between Brunswick and Strike Bowling Inc., owned by the dynamic Bill Hartoffelis from Athens, Greece. At the victory ceremony Brunswick announced the tournament to run again in March 2005 in Athens.

The tournament ended up being dominated by Danish Britt Bröndsted entering her second final in the European Bowling Tour. Britt Bröndsted defeated not less than 6 opponents on her way to the final victory.

In the three stepladder matches Britt Bröndsted defeated Pasi Uotila from Finland 227 - 175, Menno van den Heuvel from The Netherlands 225 - 188 and finally in the last match (best of three games) Maarten Krull from The Netherlands 226 - 214, 184 - 224, 220 - 214.

Maarten Krull made a five bagger at the end of the last game forcing Britt Bröndsted to make a double, which she did. It was a fantastic final in a great atmosphere in Thessalonica and a fantastic performance of the 22 year old Dane.

By her victory Britt Bröndsted is alone at the top of the European women ranking with two times maximum points out of three possible. In the European men ranking Pasi Uotila is alone as the leader after his 4th place in Thessalonica.

With his final victory (235 - 176) against Petter Hansen from Norway, Swedish Marcus Eriksson jumped in at the European Bowling Tour Top 8 standing by being awarding 30 points.

In the Men's Division Pasi Uotila from Finland enlarged his leading of the tour by being awarded 18 points for his 3rd place in the tournament. Pasi Uotila is now 31 points ahead of the second ranked in the Men's standing

Eva Jönsson from Sweden was the highest positioned women in the tournament (position 8), and adding her 30 new points to the 4 already being awarded in previous tour tournaments, she jumped into the Women's standing at position 4.

Also Danish Britt Bröndsted enlarged her leading of the European Bowling Tour 2004 by being awarded 18 points for her position as the 5th best women in the tournament. Britt Bröndsted is now 24 points ahead of the second ranked in the Women's standing.

The winner of the European Bowling Tour 2003 - Kamilla Kjeldsen from Denmark - is starting to move up in the table and with 15 points awarded in the Swedish Les Lions Cup she is now at the3rd position in this year's tour.

Story 2004-18: EYC 2004 concluded

A record number of 226 players (92 girls and 134 boys) were participating in the 17th European Youth Championships 2004, conducted in German Augsburg 9-18 April 2004.

The successors of the championships were Netherlands with 3 gold medals, Sweden, England and Finland with 2 gold medals each and finally Germany with one gold medal.

The championships were also a break-through for Ukraine and Latvia, which took the first medals in a European Youth Championships ever.

In the first match of the Girls Masters Wendy Kok from The Netherlands defeated Jennifer Billingham from England 220 - 167. The point list for each tournament has changed from 32 players being awarded points to 50 players being awarded points. There will be double points for the Majors. See the points table below.

The total tournament prize pool of the EBT 2004 was about 615.000 €, while the total prize pool of the EBT 2005 will be about 950.000 €. The average prize pool is increasing with about 11.000 € per tournament, from about 36.000 € in 2004 to about 47.000 € in 2005. The average entry fee is unchanged as about 140 € both in 2004 and in 2005.

There will be 7 new tournaments in the EBT 2005; The Irish Open Championships, (Ireland), The 3rd Catalonia Open - Trofeu Galasa (Spain), The Championship Golden Bowl (Italy), The 2nd Istanbul Bowling Open (Turkey), The Olympia Tournament (Sweden), The Gutperle Anniversary - 1st Viernheim Open (Germany) and The 1st San Marino Open (San Marino).

The prize money for the EBT 2005 itself are increased from 4.000 € in 2003 and 10.000 € in 2004 to 20.000 € in 2005. In each division the prize money for the EBT 2005 will be divided as 5.000 € for the winner, 3.000 € for the runner up and 2.000 € for the 3rd positioned.

The 8 highest ranked women and the 8 highest ranked men at the end of the EBT 2005 will qualify for the World Ranking Masters 2006 to be conducted in Kuwait during the 2nd quarter of 2006.

Back in the men's Top 8 is Karl Peter Greülich from Germany, whom advanced to position 7 after being awarded 18 points in The British Open Championships 2004.

Tim Mack, representing Sweden in the European Bowling Tour, won the tournament in Nottingham and is now present at the European ranking standing with 30 points, though still 23 points away from the Top 8 cut.

In the women's division of the European Bowling Tour 2004 the top 8 ranking remained the same after The British Open Championships 2004. Only Martina Beckel from Germany at the 2nd position was awarded points in Nottingham (12). Martina Beckel is 33 points after the leading Dane Britt Bröndsted from Denmark.

The highest ranked women in The British Open Championships 2004 was Jo Harries and by that awarded 30 points for the European ranking standing, still 21 points away from the Top 8 cut.

Story 2004-41: ECI 2004 dual lane condition

The ECI was held on 30 August - 4 September 2004 at the Rollhouse Bowling Centre, Ankara, Turkey. This was the first time the dual lane condition concept was used in a European championship. In order to gather information about the perception of players, coaches and officials a questionnaire was handed out at the Team Managers meeting.

There were players from 36 countries participating in the ECI 2004. Replies to the questionnaire have been received from 31 countries.

Despite the fact that only 35% of the players had competed on dual lane conditions prior to the ECI, 90% of them consider the concept to be fairer to the bowlers and promotes the versatility. 85% believe that the dual lane condition concept is good for selecting the best bowler as champion. Only 10% of the players are of the opinion that it favours a special type of bowler.

95% of the players looked at the oiling patterns that were published on the ECI website, but only 45% of them practiced on the conditions before travelling to the ECI. 90% of the players who had practiced on the conditions at home found a big difference in ball reaction on the lanes in Ankara.

40% of the players and 45% of the coaches are in favour of modifying the concept to use the short oil pattern on one lane and the long oil one on the other lane.

80% of the players consider that the limitation to 6 bowling balls per player is adequate.

Finland's Kimmo Lehtonen won Stop 14 in the European Bowling Tour 2004 - the Norwegian Open 2004 in Moss, Norway - and the 30 points he was awarded brought him in top 8 in the Men's EBT standing with 67 points at position 5.

Paul Moor from England kept his lead without being awarded points in Norway, while the second positioned Petter Hansen from Norway and the third positioned Pasi Uotila from Finland both was awarded points (6 respectively 4). Petter Hansen is at 84 points and Pasi Uotila at 80 pints after Stop 14. Paul Moor is still in good shape at position 1 of this year's ranking.

In the women's division of the European Bowling Tour 2004 Britt Bröndsted - awarded 18 points in Norway - again enlarged the gap to second positioned Martina Beckel from Germany. Martina Beckel is now 51 points after the leading Dane and with only three stops to go, it seems to be difficult for Martina Beckel to catch up with the Danish winner of the World Ranking Masters 2003.

The highest ranked women in Norwegian Championships 2004 were Helen Jonsson from Sweden and by the 30 points awarded she jumped into the top 8 at position 4 with 71 points. Back in the top 8 is also Sweden's Eva Jönsson whom was awarded 15 points in Norway, now at position 7 with 61 points.

The last 4-5 positions in the top 8 standings for both sexes are still very open and it looks like three exiting stops in the EBT 2004, before we can announce the 16 finalists from Europe to be qualified for the World Ranking Masters 2005 at Kegels place in Lake Wales, USA.

Some of the spots for the top 8 positions in both divisions of the European Bowling Tour 2005, which is the key to the World Ranking Masters 2005, are still very open.

Spada Amedeo from Italy won the 15th stop of the EBT 2004 - Vienna Open in Austria - though still 15 points away from the magic line of the top 8 cut.

Leading Paul Moor from England was awarded 6 points in Vienna and he kept his position as the highest ranked in Europe. Pasi Uotila from Finland moved from his previous third position to position two by being awarded 15 points. The difference between Paul Moor and Pasi Uotila is 34 points with two stops still to go.

New at the top 8 ranking in the men's division is the former 2003 World Ranking Masters and the three times 2003 World Champion Anders Öhman from Sweden at position 8.

The last 4-5 positions in the top 8 ranking is still open since a number of very strong players are positioned just outside the top 8 field.

In the women's division none of the top 8 players was exchanged, but a number of players changed their position internally in the top 8 ranking.

Britt Bröndsted from Denmark is keeping her sovereign first position with 188 points (6 points in Vienna) and even the runner up, Martina Beckel from Germany, moved 12 points closer by being awarded 18 points in Vienna (now at 149 points), the gap is still 39 between the two players, who have dominated the women's division in the EBT 2004 since the beginning of the tour in January.

The highest ranked women in Vienna, Eva Jönsson from Sweden, jumped (from 61 points to 91 points) from an unsure position at the bottom of the women's top 8 ranking to a safe place at position 4. By her achievement Eva Jönsson is only 9 points after Kamilla Kjeldsen from Denmark at the third position and Eva Jönsson can now smell the top 3 prize money.

Britt Bröndsted, Martina Beckel. Kamilla Kjeldsen and Eva Jönsson must be considered as qualified for the WRM 2005 in Lake Wales, USA, while position 5-8 still is open.

The last limitation for points to be awarded in the Zone rankings was removed by the World Tenpin Bowling Association, when the Presidium held its meeting 30-31 October 2004 in Mil-waukee - Wisconsin, USA.

Previously non-European players could be awarded points if they were holding a license in one of the ETBF member federations, but not all non-European players taking part in EBT Stops did hold such licenses and furthermore it did create some confusion from time to time, because the license status of the non-European players not always was known for the EBT Administrators.

As of 1 January 2005 the situation is changed, since all players entering a stop in the European Bowling Tour will be awarded points, no matter their nationality and no matter an eventual membership of a professional organization (decided in March 2004).

Besides the administrative advantages, the decision made by WTBA is modernizing the tour, creating a simple situation which is easy to understand for all and finally it is adding new value and credibility to the still growing European Bowling Tour.

In the EBT 2005 there are still a few stops without WTBA approval and in these stops non-European players can still not be awarded points for the simple reason that they cannot enter these tournaments. Anyhow, it will be possible for the tournaments to upgrade their approval status before their stops are conducted.

With the growing prize money pools and the many new and strong tournaments in the European Bowling Tour, it is expected that more players from outside Europe, not least US players, will enter some of the tournaments in the European Bowling Tour.

By their appearances they are contributing to even more exiting tour stops and in general to a further strengthening of the European Bowling Tour in the years to come.

The European Bowling Tour 2005 will be an open and modern series of sports events, arranged by ETBF and strongly supported by the federations, the organizers, the host centres, many sponsors, the bowling press and not least the thousands of players taking part.

Story 2004-48: Tournament approvals

Yes, indeed, if you want to participate in a tournament, it has to be approved.

A tournament has to be approved by the national bowling organisation in the country. If players from 4 (four) or more different nationalities are participating, then the tournament also has to be approved by the European Tenpin Bowling Federation (ETBF). If players from other zones than the European Zone are taking part, an approval from the World Tenpin Bowling Association (WTBA) is required. Simple isn't it?

Nevertheless it sometimes happens that players are taking part in unapproved tournaments. This, ladies and gentlemen is prohibited! WTBA, ETBF and national rules forbid participation in unapproved tournaments.

A question we quite often hear is: How do I know, as a player, whether the tournament is approved? The answer is: All tournaments that have approval from ETBF and/or WTBA are mentioned on this website.

It would be an ideal situation if all national federations had their own website and if they would publish all tournaments that have been approved by them; this is not the case yet. The best thing to do is to contact the national federation concerned and ask them. Do not take the risk of participating in an unapproved tournament.

There is one more thing: The organizer of the tournament that you are participating in may ask for your valid license card or a certification letter provided by your national federation. Make sure that your name and license number appears on the list of participants of that tournament.

I wish you a lot of nice scores and most important: enjoy yourself.

Paul Moor from England is the winner of the men's division of the European Bowling Tour 2004. In the 16th stop of the tour - The 1st Oltremare Championships in Naples, Italy - he was awarded 12 points and since his nearest by positioned opponents did not play in Naples he became a sovereign winner, one stop before the conclusion of the tour. Paul Moor is awarded 149 points in total, 46 points ahead of Pasi Uotila from Finland at position 2 with 95 points.

Anders Öhman from Sweden was again proving that he is back among the top bowlers in Europe, when he was awarded 30 points as the highest ranked man in the tournament, where he was the runner up after England's Zara Glover. In the overall ranking Anders Öhman is at position 3 with 91 points.

The best eight players in the EBT 2004 are qualified for the World Ranking Masters 2005 in Lake Wales, Florida. At the actual standing in the men's division 3 players are sharing the positions 7, 8 and 9 with 67 points - it is going to be a very exiting last stop in Kungsbacka in December.

It is still not possible to declare the winner of the women's division of the EBT 2005, since leading Britt Bröndsted did not play in Naples and in her absence the second positioned Martina Beckel from Germany came closer to the leader by being awarded 21 points as the second best female player in Naples. The gap between the two women is only 18 points before the last stop in Kungsbacka (188 vs. 170).

Zara Glover from England was awarded 30 points as the winner of the 1st Oltremare Championships and by her point improvements in the last two stops she is now at the 5th position in the EBT 2005 with 90 points.

Also in the women's division there is a tie for the top 8 cut since two women are sharing the positions 8 and 9 with 71 points.
