Story 2007-01: EBT perspectives

The European Bowling Tour 2006 became the most played tour in Europe ever, since the tour had 4.516 first starters, which is an average of 226 players per stop. The average number of players per stop in 2005 was 224.

Like in 2005, the tournament with most first starters in 2006 became the German tournament Gutperle Viernheim Open with 372 participants, closely followed by the Greek tournament Brunswick Euro Challenge with 369 participants. These tournaments was also the two tournaments with the highest prize funds, namely 100.000 € for Gutperle Viernheim Open and 85.000 € for Brunswick Euro Challenge.

The tour consisted of 20 top tournaments from 15 different countries, of which Sweden contributed with 3 tournaments, Denmark, The Netherlands and Spain all with two tournaments each, Austria, Finland, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Malta, Norway, San Marino and Turkey all with one tournament each.

The total prize fund in the 20 stops were $1.040.000 \\\in$ / $52.000 \\\in$ per stop, while the figures for 2005 were 970.000 $\\\in$ / 48.000 per stop. The pay back factor for the player's increased from 322 in 2005 to 328 in 2006.

Both in 2005 and in 2006 ETBF paid in addition 40.000 € in prizes and players support for those qualified for the World Ranking Masters.

15 different women became the highest ranked woman in a stop. Five of them did it twice, namely Britt Bröndsted from Denmark, Isabelle Saldjian from France, Tina Hulch from Germany, Anna Mattsson-Baard from Sweden and Helén Johnsson from Sweden. Ten women did it once, Anja Ginge Jensen from Denmark, Zara Glover from England, Patricia Schwarz from Germany, Tanya Petty from Germany, Mor Aviram from Israel, Ghislaine van der Tol from The Netherlands, Laura Rhoney from Scotland, Nina Flack from Sweden, Diana Alfredsson from Sweden and Liz Johnson from USA.

16 different men became the highest ranked man in a stop. Paul Moor from England did it three times, Lasse Lintilä from Finland and Peter Ljung from Sweden did it twice and the following 13 men did it all one time: Jason Belmonte from Australia, Thomas Gross from Austria, Chris van Damme from Belgium, Stuart Williams from England, Nick Froggatt from England, Osku Palermaa from Finland, Yoan Alix from France, Achim Grabowski from Germany, Wu Siu Hong from Hong Kong, Frederico Rossi from Italy, Svein Roger Olsen from Norway, Mikael Kanold from Sweden and Tobias Karlsson from Sweden.

For the third time in a row Britt Bröndsted from Denmark won the women's division and Paul Moor from England won the men's division in the European Bowling Tour.

In 2007 the tour prize fund increases again, this time to $1.150.000 \in /55.000 \in$ per stop in the 21 stops, played in 16 different countries.

As usual the tour begins with traditional Ballmaster in Helsinki in January and concludes with Kungsbacka International Tournament in Sweden in December.

ETBF looks forward to another record breaking tour season 2007 where Kegel again will be the lane maintenance partner for ETBF.

Story 2007-03: Centre certification

A relatively limited number of federations in Europe have an active centre certification programme, which is understandable, because such a programme demands both resources and high technical skills, which are not necessary always available in all federations.

As a consequence, the ETBF Presidium has established the ETBF Centre Certification Programme, which consists of two "legs": a technical inspection and a possible ETBF Centre Certification.

The ETBF Centre Certification Programme, which was decided by the ETBF Presidium at a meeting in October 2006, is active with immediate effect.

With the exception of ETBF Championships and stops in the European Bowling Tour with an EBT Premier status, an ETBF Centre Certification is optional for centres in Europe and an ETBF Centre Certification will never replace a national centre certification in any ETBF member federation.

Story 2007-04: EBT 2007-01

The 2007 European Bowling Tour season (the 8th of its kind) took off with the traditional Brunswick Ballmaster Open, conducted in famous Tali Bowling Stadium in Helsinki.

Brunswick Ballmaster Open is organized by the company Kimmo Lehtonen OY, which is owned by Kimmo Lehtonen, who also became the winner of the tournament. This is, to our best knowledge, the first time an organizer of a tour stop becomes the winner as well; an extraordinary achievement.

Kimmo Lehtonen defeated Sweden's Martin Larsen (the reigning World Champion in the Men's Doubles) with 225 vs. 209 in the one game final.

Another curiosity in the tournament is a President of a federation becoming among the best 8 players, which is going as far as the quarter finals in Brunswick Ballmaster Open. This happened for the newly elected President of the Finnish Bowling Federation, Jouni Helminen, when he reached that far in this year's Brunswick Ballmaster Open.

The highest ranked women in Helsinki became Piritta Kantola, who has been the highest ranked women of a tour stop two times previously, which is the case also for Kimmo Lehtonen.

The European Bowling Tour 2007 took off very well this year, when not less than 363 players attended Brunswick Ballmaster Open, which were visited by 328 players in 2006 and 281 players in 2005. I total there were 738 starters in 2007 (363 entries and 375 re-entries).

Congratulations to Kimmo Lehtonen and Brunswick Ballmaster Open for their increased and successful participation and for a great beginning of the 8th tour season in Europe.

Story 2007-07: WRM 2007 not in Qatar

Yesterday it became clear for the ETBF Presidium that Qatar Bowling Federation has decided to cancel the World Ranking Masters 2007.

The cancellation, which comes with a very short notice since the WRM 2007 was supposed to be conducted 30 April - 6 May in Doha, was apparently necessary because the roof of the bowling centre needs a repair in exactly the period, where the WRM 2007 should have been played.

We received the information from the WTBA Secretary General yesterday, who also could inform us that there is no actual solution to this suddenly occurred situation.

Basically there will be two possible solutions; either to cancel the WRM 2007 completely or to locate another host with a very short notice. We were informed by WTBA, that a final decision will be taken at the latest 28 February.

The situation is indeed very regrettable for the sport of bowling in general, for the ranking system in specific and of course not least for the players qualified for the WRM 2007.

Besides being regrettable for many reasons, a cancellation of the final for the three zone tours are far from acceptable for ETBF, and the ETBF Presidium have therefore immediately decided to take action in a number of areas.

Non-refundable flight tickets

If no WRM 2007 will be conducted, ETBF has requested WTBA to raise a financial claim for Qatar Bowling Federation, with the purpose to fund players who have documented non-refundable flight tickets, already booked for the WRM 2007 for themselves and eventually companions.

Financial compensation for the 16 players qualified from Europe

ETBF keeps € 20.000, which should have been used for players travel and accommodation support for the WRM 2007 and for Europe's part of the WRM 2007 prize money.

If no WRM 2007 will be conducted, the € 20.000 will be divided equally among the 16 qualified players from Europe and soonest possible after a decision from WTBA is known, each player will receive € 1.250 as a financial compensation for the non-conducted ranking final.

EBT Masters as of 2008

The ETBF Presidium wants to eliminate any risk of another similar situation ever to occur again, and it is therefore decided to introduce an independent European Bowling Tour final - THE EBT MASTERS - which will be conducted for the first time in 2008, based on the end standing of the women and men divisions of the European Bowling Tour 2007.

Originally the EBT Masters was meant to be played for the first time in 2009, but as a consequence of the very unfortunate situation for the WRM 2007, the ETBF Presidium decided to expedite the conduction of the first EBT Masters with one year.

The creation of an EBT Masters, and following changes, are described in a separate story concerning the EBT Masters in the future.

We will, naturally, keep you posted about any development in the WRM 2007 situation in the coming period.

Story 2007-08: EBT Masters as of 2008

The ETBF Presidium has decided to until the bands between the European Bowling Tour and the World Ranking System.

The decision was in the first hand meant to be in effect as of the EBT 2008, but as a consequence of the recently uncertainty of the conduction of the World Ranking Masters 2007, it became obvious for the ETBF Presidium, that it was essential to untie the bands with immediate effect, meaning as of the EBT 2007 already.

As a result of this strategic decision, the following will be in effect as of 2007:

The EBT will get its own final, under the name EBT Masters and it will be conducted for the first time in 2008 as the final of the EBT 2007.

The top 16 women and the top 16 men of the end standing of the EBT 2007 will qualify for the EBT Masters 2008.

ETBF will guarantee that an EBT Masters <u>will</u> be conducted every year and accordingly there will be no doubt that the top ranked players of an EBT <u>will</u> qualify for a final.

ETBF opens for the possibility that tournaments outside the jurisdiction of ETBF could be adopted in an EBT, but not necessarily already in 2008.

Should the World Ranking Masters 2007 (or later) be conducted, then the EBT still counts as the qualification for the WRM and it will still be the top 8 women and the top 8 men of the end standing of an EBT, who will be qualified for participation.

The WRM will, anyhow, as of the EBT 2007, be considered as an optional and additional opportunity to compete for the top 8 ranked in each division and their participation in an eventually WRM will no longer be financially supported by ETBF.

As a natural consequence of the creation of the EBT Masters, most of the tour prize money will be canalized to the EBT Masters as of 2007, but a prize of \leq 2.500 for each of the tour winners in 2007 will remain.

In the same spirit the financial travel support will be removed, but ETBF will ensure that each of the 32 participants in the EBT Masters will be awarded a minimum of \in 500, at this moment presumed as \in 500 to the 8 lowest positioned players in each division.

ETBF expects a minimum prize pool for the first EBT Masters of not less than € 40.000, but hopefully higher, all depending on possible name sponsors and bids from potential organizers.

The format of the EBT Masters will, from a starting point of view, be identical to the format of the European Champions Cup. This means for each gender / division; 3 X 8 games qualification (one long oil squad, one short oil squad and one mixed oil squad) followed by a top 8 elimination in best of 3 games matches.

A possibility is to conduct the EBT Masters on Monday-Wednesday just after the conclusion of one of the tour stops, but this is only **one** possibility. The host of an EBT Masters can, besides being one of the stop organizers, be a federation or a company, as decided by the ETBF Presidium.

The minimum mandatory requirements for an EBT Masters organizer are airport transportation service at arrival and departure, shuttle service hotel-centre-hotel during the event, normal

host administration costs and all expenses related to a Technical Delegate, unless an external lane maintenance agreement covering the EBT Masters exists.

In addition (and optional) it is possible for the EBT Masters organizer, to offer additional prize money for an EBT Masters. Such additional prize money will be added to the minimum guaranteed prize money pool.

The EBT Masters will, preferably, be conducted in the interval of February - July, but exceptional good bids from a potential EBT Masters organizer can influence the decision of the dates of the EBT Masters.

When this press story is published, ETBF is ready to accept bids from organizers applying for hosting the first two EBT Masters in 2008 and 2009. An official invitation to apply for hosting these two events will be issued shortly from now.

ETBF has opened for tournament organizers to apply for their tournaments to be adopted in the European Bowling Tour 2008, which is the 9th consecutive tour in Europe.

The ETBF Presidium has a strong believe, that the EBT 2008 will be another record breaking year for the tour in Europe.

Some news for 2008, previously announced

EBT Masters

The top 16 in the women's and the top 16 in the men's end standings of an EBT will qualify for the following year's EBT Masters, which will be conducted for the first time in 2008 based on the end standings of the EBT 2007. The EBT 2008 will count as qualification for the EBT Masters 2009.

EBT Premier

As of 2008 there will be three categories of tournaments in a tour, since the ETBF Presidium has introduced an EBT Premier category with many high class criteria to be met.

Tournaments from outside Europe

The ETBF Presidium has decided that tournaments conducted in countries outside the jurisdiction of ETBF might be adopted in an EBT. This, anyhow, does not necessarily happen already in 2008.

Category criteria for 2008, also previously announced

Two already existing definitions

The total prize fund of a tournament is defined as all prize money allocated for individual players in the international part of the tournament.

The Entry value is defined as a ratio used to evaluate the interrelation between the size of the prize fund and the maximum entry fee.

EBT Challengers, also adopted in the EBT 2007

The total prize fund must be minimum € 30.000

The entry value must be minimum 175

The number of players per pair of lanes in qualification squads can be 2-6

EBT Challengers, not previously adopted

The total prize fund must be minimum € 40.000

The entry value must be minimum 225

The number of players per pair of lanes in qualification squads can be 2-4

EBT Majors

The total prize fund must be minimum € 55.000

The entry value must be minimum 325

The number of players per pair of lanes in qualification squads can be 2-4

The tournament must have been adopted in a previous EBT

EBT Premiers

The total prize fund must be minimum € 100.000

The entry value must be minimum 500

The number of players per pair of lanes in qualification squads can be 2-4

The tournament must have been adopted in a previous EBT

In addition a lot more special criteria exist for an EBT Premier, which all can be found in the EBT 2008 Rules - available at www.etbf.dk under the item Publications.

Three important deadlines

In addition to opening for applications for tournament adoptions in the EBT 2008, the ETBF Presidium opens for bids from organizers, who are interested in hosting the first EBT Masters in 2008 and the second EBT Masters in 2009.

Applications for adoption in the EBT 2008

The deadline for tournament organizers to apply for adoption in the European Bowling Tour 2008 will be 30 April 2007 and shortly after the composition of the EBT 2008 will be published. Applications for hosting the EBT Masters 2008

The deadline of applications for hosting the EBT Masters 2008 is 1 July 2007. Applications for hosting the EBT Masters 2009

The deadline of applications for hosting the EBT Masters 2009 is 1 October 2007.

Already after two stops in the European Bowling Tour 2007, Paul Moor from England is back in lead of the tour, which he won already three consecutive times in 2004, 2005 and 2006.

In the 2nd stop of the EBT 2007, the Hammer Bronzen Schietspoel Tournament 2007 - conducted in Dolfijn Bowling in Tilburg, Paul Moor won the 4 person final in a superior style with 515 over the two games against Osku Palermaa from Finland with 435, Peter Smits from The Netherlands with 430 and Maarten Pittens from the Netherlands with 360.

This was the 9th highest ranked position in a tour stop for Paul More and by that he broke another tour record, since he passed the 8 highest ranked tour stops for legendary Gery Verbruggen from Belgium, which held the record before the tournament in Tilburg.

Martina Beckel from Germany became the highest ranked women (her 5th highest ranked position ever) in Tilburg, which brought her in a shared tour lead together with Piritta Kantola from Finland.

Paul Moor leads the men's division with 130 points, while Piritta Kantola and Martina Beckel have 100 points each in the women's division.

The ETBF Presidium is welcoming Albanian Federation of Bowling as the 49^{th} member federation in the ETBF family. On 24 February 2007 Albania was accepted by the FIQ Presidium as a provisional member.

In Albania there are 3 bowling centres with a total of 28 lanes. The federation has a little bit over 160 individual members.

Story 2007-16: Long and short oil

The "Long and the Short of It" is now reality; is it also the future?

An ultramodern proprietor, Ronald Dol of Bowling Dolfijn, along with avant-garde event organizer Luc Jansen of The Netherlands, and the forward thinking European Bowling Tour (EBT) have just completed a major bowling tour event which employed lane conditions like never before, at least on purpose.

During the entire 2007 EBT Bronzen Hammer Schietspoel Open, every left lane was conditioned with a 45' oil pattern designed to play more towards the inside part of the lane and every right lane was conditioned with a 35' oil pattern designed to play towards the outside part of the lane. Paul Moor, the reigning three times defending European Bowling Tour Ranking Champion proved those titles are well deserved as he defeated Osku Palermaa, Peter Smits and Maarten Pittens in a final two games shootout of this ground-breaking major event.

In the year 2000, then WTBA President PS Nathan called for a World Symposium in Malaysia to address many perceived problems related to the sport of bowling. Out of the symposium the WTBA Technical Committee, which was headed by Sid Allen at the time, concluded "that a single condition format was unfair, since it favoured a particular style of play regardless of how the lane was oiled."

Until now both the EBT and the PBA Tour formats make use of a single oil pattern for all rounds of competition. With these single condition events at times come social acceptance if the outcome is perceived fair by the bowling public but far too often the opposite is true. This social unrest comes as the winner of the event is perceived to have "matched up" because of their dominant style of play instead of just plainly performing better than the rest.

During that symposium in Malaysia the WTBA Technical Committee also felt the question of "who is the best bowler?" needed to be further examined. Through discussion and digging deeper into the question, the WTBA defined what they feel the traits that make up a World Class bowling player should be. The committee created what is known as VPARK; Versatility, Power, Accuracy, Repeatability and Knowledge. There was one trait however that was at the very top of each members list, Versatility.

The members felt that "the ability to bowl over a wide range of conditions elevated a player from one of quality to that of greatness" and therefore led to the conclusion "that WTBA's present oiling procedures were not conducive to identifying and rewarding great players, but instead only identified the specialists." Then committee member Craig Woodhouse suggested the concept of multiple conditions and it was unanimously agreed that this is the path for all future World Championships.

An over whelming majority of single condition events employ conditions in the thirty-seven to forty-two foot range. The WTBA dual condition events however use oil patterns thirty-five feet or shorter and forty-three feet or longer. So where does that leave the bowling players of the world to prepare for these World Championship events? The answer is you either need to own or have parents that own a bowling centre or have a federation that supports such training. Not many participants have either.

For the EBT Tilburg dual condition tournament to be successful and socially accepted, it was evident that during the event some educational seminars dedicated to playing the short and long patterns were needed. With the help of Hammer's Mike Quitter and bowling ball expert Denny Torgersen, material about what bowling ball types and layouts should be used was presented. With the help of Kegel and this writer, material about the bowling lane, oil patterns and keys to play those patterns, was also presented. With almost ninety tournament partici-

pants attending the seminars, the tournament players and coaches got a head start of what to expect.

Fully realizing "baby steps" needed to be taken, the design of the patterns were on the forgiving side and such that the widest variety of bowling balls could be used. In contrast to some of the early dual condition Championship events, it was refreshing to see the players in Tilburg clearly understood how the patterns needed to be attacked.

The feedback from the players according to Ronald Dol confirmed what Sid Allen's group had concluded in that year 2000 symposium, that "dual lane conditions are fairer than a single condition event." Will dual conditions be a thing of the future? Ronald Dol sure believes it will and he felt "they had a tremendous event with a great deal of enthusiasm from the players and spectators." Dol and Jansen have already confirmed the 2008 EBT event in Tilburg will be dual lane conditions again.

It's only a matter of time before more tournament organizers follow the lead of the innovative group in The Netherlands. Dual conditions may not be the answer the sporting players are looking for at each and every event or might it? After all it does satisfy the most essential criteria of becoming a world class bowling player...VERSATILITY.

During the last week we have unfortunately received 2 cancellations from tournaments adopted in the European Bowling Tour 2007.

For some days ago the organizer of Kungsbacka International Tournament (EBT 2007-21) notified us about a cancellation of his tournament and today we received another cancellation from the organizer of Gutperle Viernheim Open (EBT 2007-15).

The organizer of Kungsbacka International Tournament announced the EBT Rules 2007 to be the reason for his wish to cancel. To this we will state that all central parts of the EBT Rules for 2007 has been unchanged since they were published for a year ago, which also indicates that all premises for the organizer in Kungsbacka would have been exactly the same, when the tournament should have been conducted in December this year, as they were when the organizer in June 2006 applied for his tournament to be adopted in the EBT 2007. In general ETBF never changes the central rules and premises for one year's tour, after the tour has been published.

Adding a very good attendance of 261 players in the 2006 issue of the tournament, it is hard for ETBF to understand the real rational behind the cancellation, but it is anyhow a fact that the organizer do not want to conduct the tournament in 2007.

Concerning the Gutperle Viernheim Open, the organizer is announcing the German tax rules, and indeed a very though interpretation of these rules in 2006, to be the main reason for the cancellation. We have no reason to doubt in this factual information from the organizer, but anyhow we regret very much the loose of Gutperle Viernheim Open in the EBT 2007.

According to the general EBT Rules, it is de facto not possible for any tournament to leave the tour after the composition of the tour is published. The two tournaments will therefore keep their tour stop numbers (15 and 21); no matter they will not be conducted.

The tournaments are furthermore obliged to pay their EBT fees, exactly as it is the case for the previously cancelled Olympia Tournament in Helsingborg, for the purpose to contribute financially to the EBT 2007 thy once joined and for the benefit of the players in the tour. We indeed expect all three organizers to fulfil their obligations concerning the EBT 2007 fees.

Despite this hick up's in the ongoing tour, there is still many more excellent tour stops to enter for all interested bowlers from all over the World and ETBF will continue unabated to develop its EBT products over the coming years for the benefit of bowling in Europe.

For the second year in a row, Osku Palermaa from Finland entered the final match of the Brunswick Euro Challenge (EBT 2007 Stop 05), but this year with a better result than last year, where he lost against his dual handed colleague from Australia, Jason Belmonte.

In this year's tournament in Thessaloniki, Osku Palermaa did not leave any doubt open and he delivered an outstanding game of 268 vs. a 215 game bowled by his opponent, the 2004 winner of the Brunswick Euro Challenge, Britt Bröndsted from Denmark.

The triple tour winner and also actual tour leader, Paul Moor from England, earned 44 points in Thessaloniki, accumulating his season total to 268, but Paul Moor can feel the breath of Osku Palermaa (100 points in Thessaloniki) with 262 points and Martin Larsen from Sweden with 240 points (60 points in Thessaloniki), just behind him.

In the women's division, Kirsten Penny from England kept her top position by being awarded 60 points in Thessaloniki (238 points in 2007), but also Kirsten Penny can feel the nearest by positioned pursuers just behind her, since the triple tour queen Britt Bröndsted has collected 216 points and Piritta Kantola from Finland 208 points in 2007 so far.

Ghislaine van der Tol from The Netherlands won the women division in Stop 11 of the European Bowling Tour 2007, Eden Leisure's Malta Open Championships, after a 7 pin win (198-191) over Mai Ginge Jensen from Denmark in the final of the women's division.

It was the 3rd time Ghislaine van der Tol became the highest ranked women in a tour stop and the first time it happened for her outside The Netherlands.

Tour leading Kirsten Penny from England was awarded 20 points on Malta and she enlarged the gap to the Danish runner up Britt Bröndsted 502 vs. 411 so far in the season.

Therese Forsell from Sweden (35 points on Malta) became the only new women in top 16 at position 14.

In the men's division the recently crowned World Ranking Masters Stuart Williams from England succeeded with a 1 pin victory against his fellow countryman Nick Froggatt 225 vs. 224 in the final of the men's division. It was William's first tour stop win in 2007 and the 4th time ever he became the highest ranked in a stop.

Stuart Williams took one position (from 7 to 6) in the men's division of the EBT 2007, while Nikolay Ovchinnikov from Latvia took one position from 10 to 9 with the 6 points he was awarded on Malta. No other male player's in top 16 was awarded points on Malta and no new players entered the top 16 of the men's division.

The men's division of the EBT 2007 is still led by Finland's Osku Palermaa with 499 points in front of England's Paul Moor with 452 points.

Story 2007-37: EBT 2008 composed

At an ETBF Presidium meeting, held on 5 July 2008 in Vienna - Austria, the composition of the European Bowling Tour 2008 was decided.

The EBT 2008 consists of 18 tournaments, of which 6 have been granted the EBT Challenger status and 12 have been granted the EBT Major status. The 18 tournaments will be conducted in 14 different countries. The composition of the EBT 2008 and detailed information of each stop is presented in the EBT 2008 Calendar on this site.

Of the 18 tournaments to be conducted in the EBT 2007, the organizers of Husqvarna International (Sweden), Malta Open and Norwegian Open has decided not to re-apply for adoption in the EBT 2008, while a similar number of new tournaments (three) is adopted in the EBT 2008, namely the 2nd Maribor Open Strike Tournament (Slovenia), Lahti Open (Finland) and the 7th Qatar International Open Bowling Tournament 2008.

It is the first time a tournament from Slovenia is adopted, it is the first time two tournaments from Finland is adopted and it is indeed the first time a tournament from Qatar is adopted. The adoption of the tournament from Qatar introduces a new era of the European Bowling Tour, since it is the first time we are going outside the traditional European area for a tournament adoption.

The possibility to adopt one or more high class tournaments from outside Europe were published by the introduction of the EBT 2008 Rules on 30 October 2006 and we are very proud and satisfied, already from the first possible year, to be able to present the tournament in Qatar as the first non-European tournament in the tour - a tournament which also will be the richest ever in the history of the EBT, since a tremendous prize pool of not less than 120.000 € is offered by the organizer.

The total prize pool (including tour prize money) for the 18 tournaments in the EBT 2007 will be 1.000.000 €, while the total prize pool for the 18 tournaments in the EBT 2008 will be 1.175.000 €. This very visible improvement dose indeed also influence the average prize pool per tournament, which increases from 52.000 € in 2007 to 62.000 € in 2008.

The top 16 women and the top 16 men after the 18 stops in the EBT 2008 will qualify for the EBT Masters 2009, while the top 8 women and the top 8 men in addition will qualify for the WRM 2009.

The EBT 2008 is - as always - open for all bowlers in the World and all bowlers can be awarded points, no matter their nationality.

Kegel is, for the fourth consecutive year, appointed as the official lane maintenance partner for ETBF, meaning that Kegel staff will be at the sites and Kegel equipment will be in use in a number of stops throughout the 2008 season.

Story 2007-38: ETBF Congress in Vienna

On 7 July the ordinary Congress of ETBF was held at the Ibis Hotel Mariahilf in Vienna, Austria. The Congress was, like in many previous years, constructive, positive and not the least efficient. The Congress lasted no longer than 5 hours including lunch break.

Below you will find a presentation of the most important decisions for the coming years:

European Youth Championships

As a consequence of the continued increasing number of participants in the EYC, the Congress decided as follows:

Each federation will be allowed to be represented by a maximum of 4 girls and 4 boys instead of 6 girls and 6 boys.

The events will be Singles - Doubles - Team of Four - All Event - Masters. The Singles event and the Team of Four are new events, which replace the Trios and the Team of Five events.

There will, in the same way as for the European Men Championships and the European Women Championships, be one game Semi Finals and a one game final in four of the events. The All Event standing will be decided after the 18 games pin fall.

The EYC Masters qualification will still be played over 18 games and on a single lane condition, since the Congress decided not to introduce dual lane conditions for the youth.

The changes will be in effect as of the EYC 2009 in Sweden, while the EYC 2008 in Helsinki will be the last youth championships played according to the present rules.

European Gold Cup

After years of discussions and problems with handicap calculations because of different registration systems from country to country and in addition problems to locate hosts for the event, the Congress decided to terminate the European Gold Cup as of 2008.

This means that the recently conducted Gold Cup in Cyprus became the last of its kind.

PBA members in European Championships

It was decided to open European Championships for all individual members of our federations, no matter if they are members of other clubs, tours or organizations in addition to a federation membership.

This means that PBA members, previous as well as present, can participate in European Championships as of 2008, under the premise that they are selected by their federations to their respectively national teams.

Limited ball check at championships

In effect already as of the next championship in Europe, which is the European Champions Cup in Luxembourg in September this year, the massive and complete check of all bowling balls of all participating players will not be done any longer.

Prior to the start of the championship there will be no mandatory inspection of the balls, only registration of those to be used during competition. Immediately prior to the start of the Semi Finals of the doubles, trios and team events, as well as prior to the start of Step 4 in the Masters event the bowling balls of the players who have qualified for the Semi Finals will be completely inspected. If an "illegal" ball is found at that inspection, the player will be disqualified and all scores declared null and void.

Reduced number of presidium members

Shortly after the Congress in 2005 one of the Presidium members decided to resign, and accordingly during the past two years 6 instead of 7 persons have carried out the work.

It was therefore proposed by the Presidium to permanently reduce the number of Presidium members to 6, which was accepted by the Congress to be effective immediately.

The Presidium for the coming two years

Kim Thorsgaard Jensen was re-elected as Vice President of ETBF for a 4 years term and Roni Ashkenazi was re-elected as ETBF Presidium member, also for a 4 years term. Both were elected by acclamation.

Story 2007-39: EMC 2007 in Vienna

What a year for Norway's super talented Mads Sandbäkken; World Youth Masters Champion in July 2006, Runner up in the European Champions Cup in September 2006 and then as the latest trophy the crown of the Masters title at the recently conducted European Men Championships in Vienna, Austria.

Mads Sandbäkken defeated Finland's Petteri Salonen 2-0 (230-225 and 229-209) in the best of three games final in the well-known Plus Halle in Vienna. In the two Semi Finals, Mads Sandbäkken defeated Dennis Eklund from Sweden 2-0, while Petri Salonen defeated Mike Quarry from England (2-1).

Since 1962 the European Masters title has been bowled 13 times and after Sandbäkken's victory Norway is, by 4 titles, the most winning nation of the European Men Masters title ever. Besides Sandbäkken's 2007 title, the history book proves titles for Arne Svein Ström in 1973 and 1981 and for Tore Torgersen in 1997.

The All Event gold went to Finland's Osku Palermaa, the Team gold went to Sweden, the Trios gold went to Finland and the Double gold went, in an inferno of noise, excitement and emotions, to two players from the Austrian host country - Thomas Tybl and Thomas Gross.

A record number of 207 male players took mart in this 2nd European Championships only for men (the previous record was 161 men players in the EMC 2005), which for the first time (like for the women in 2006) included Semi Finals and a final in the Doubles event, the Trios event and the Team event.

The organizer of Ankara Open has offered to organize the 1st EBT Masters, which will include the Top 16 women and the Top 16 men at the end standings of the European Bowling Tour 2007. The ETBF Presidium has decided to accept the offer from the organizer.

The 1st EBT Masters will be bowled in Rollhouse Bowling Centre in Ankara, Turkey in the days following the conclusion of the Ankara Open on Sunday 21 September 2008. The 1st EBT Masters will be played over three days, which is Monday-Wednesday 22-24 September 2008 and departure on Thursday 25 September 2008.

The format of the 1st EBT Masters is 3 qualification squads of 8 games each (one squad at short oil, one squad at long oil and one squad at mixed oil) followed by a Top 8 Elimination in best of three games matches, until the 1st EBT Men Masters and the 1st EBT Women Masters is found.

A minimum prize pool of $40.000 \in \text{will}$ be provided (20.000 $\in \text{for each gender}$) and no player taking part will win less than $500 \in \text{.}$

The deadline for organizers / federations / companies, who wants to apply for hosting the 2nd EBT Masters 2009 (based on the EBT 2008 end standings), is 1 September 2007.

The 12th stop of the European Bowling Tour 2007, the 3rd Storm San Marino Open conducted in beautiful and hospital Rosen' Bowl, became an nearly all Malaysian affair.

When the tournament turned into head-to-head matches 7 of the 16 bowlers represented Team Malaysia, at the quarter finals 3 of the 8 bowlers represented Team Malaysia and the same was the case when 4 bowlers were left back for the Semi Finals.

In the first Semi Final Aaron Kong from Malaysia defeated Sharon Koh from Malaysia 502 - 499 in the 2 games match, while Ghislaine Tol from The Netherlands defeated Shalin Zulkifli from Malaysia 464 - 399 in the other Semi Final.

In the Malaysian - Dutch final the outcome of the 2 games match became a tie of 477-477, where after Ghislaine van der Tol became the winner of the tournament with the highest last game 267 - 255.

Aaron Kong became the first man from Malaysia to be highest ranked in a tour stop in Europe, while Ghislaine van der Tol became the highest ranked women in a tour stop for the fourth time ever, for the second time this season, for the second time in a row and for the second time in a row Ghislaine van der Tol won a tour stop; a fantastic achievement of the young and very talented Dutch player.

In the women's division of the European Bowling Tour the gap between leading Kirsten Penny from England and the runner up Britt Bröndsted from Denmark was reduced a little in the absence of Kirsten Penny, but the gap is still 67 points since no more than 24 points were awarded to Britt Bröndsted in San Marino.

Ivonne Gross from Austria entered the Top 16 in the women's division at position 14 (28 points in San Marino), and the same did Veronica Lantto from Sweden at position 16 (48 points in San Marino).

In the men's division the gap between leading Osku Palermaa and the runner up Paul Moor was reduced to 15 points, when Palermaa was awarded 48 points in San Marino and Moor 80 points. Besides that, not much happened in the ranking of the men's division and no new players entered the Top 16 ranking.

The tournament in San Marino have had a really remarkable development in the number of players entering in its only 3 years history so far; 134 players in 2005, 187 players in 2006 and not less than 270 players in 2007, a big applause to the organizers for a job very well done.

The 29th Internacional Ciutat de Barcelona, the 13th stop of the European Bowling Tour 2007, was as always conducted in well-known Bowling Pedrables in Barcelona.

Robert Andersson from Sweden won the 2 matches stepladder final of the tournament, first by defeating his partner in the Swedish super double, Martin Larsen, with 208 vs. 174 and then by defeating Krista Pöllänen from Finland 218 vs. 206.

Robert Andersson was highest ranked in the men's division for the 4th time in his career and for the 2nd time this season.

The top three in the men's division of the EBT 2007 is still Osku Palermaa from Finland with 617 points (70 points in Barcelona), Paul Moor from England with 582 points (50 points in Barcelona) and Martin Larsen from Sweden with 444 points (80 points in Barcelona).

In the women's division Krista Pöllänen became the highest ranked women in a tour stop for the first time since 2003 and the 100 points awarded brought her from a position 15 to position 10 in the standing with a total of 260 points.

The constantly ongoing top battle in the EBT 2007 between England's Kirsten Penny and Denmark's Britt Bröndsted became a little more intense, since the gap was reduced with another 34 points after Penny was awarded 16 points (total 518 points) and Bröndsted 50 points (total 485 points) in Barcelona.

The two top raked women are now closely followed by Netherlands's Ghislaine van der Tol with a total of 421 points, who have had a fantastic series of positions 5, 1, 1 and 3 in the ranking standings of the last 4 stops.

Story 2007-48: Congress decisions

At the Congress of World Tenpin Bowling Federation, held in Monterrey, Mexico on 29 August 2007, the following important decisions for the sport were made:

The concepts of professionals and amateurs deleted

After years of discussions of deleting the concepts of professionals and amateurs from the rules, it finally materialized at the 2007 WTBA Congress in Mexico.

As of 2008 any bowler, regardless if he holds a memberships of a professional organisation (e.g. PBA), can represent his/her country as long as the player is a member of the national federation of the country he/she represents.

Semi Finals and finals in disciplines

In all World Championships there will be Semi Finals and finals in singles, doubles, trios and team in addition to the masters, where Semi Finals and finals already exist. Top four in each event will play two Semi Finals, both losers of the Semi Finals will be awarded bronze medals and the two winners will play a final. All matches will be played over 1 game. The highest ranked player/team in each match chooses the lane pattern (short oil or long oil) of the match.

Dual lane condition still not completely implemented

A proposal to delete the single event and increase the amount of games in the double event to 12 (6 games on short oil and 6 games on long oil), just like the doubles in the European Championships, failed and a full implementation of the dual lane conditions in World Championships is still outstanding.

No players exchange in the team event during a block

The possibility of exchanging a player during a 3 games block in the team event, in case of illness or injury, was removed and in the future it is only possible to exchange a player in between blocks in the team event, no longer during a block.

Age limit in the World Youth Championships

The age limit for WYC will be lowered from 23 years to 21 years, effective as of the WYC 2010.

Altering the surface of bowling balls

Altering the surface of bowling balls is in the future allowed during practice sessions before a competition round and between competition rounds.

Elections

The WTBA Presidium consists of 9 persons: a President, a 1st Vice President and a 2nd Vice President (all elected at a WTBA Congress) and two representatives from each of the three zones.

Kirsten Penny from England took her third highest ranked position in 2007 in the women's division in the 14th stop of the European Bowling Tour 2007, Ankara Open conducted in Rollhouse Bowling Centre.

By the 50 points awarded to Kirsten Penny, she enlarged the gap to her nearest rival of the tour throne in 2007, the three times tour champion from Denmark, Britt Bröndsted, to 48 points. Bröndsted was awarded 35 points in Ankara.

No new players entered top 16 of the women's standing of the EBT 2007.

The tournament was won by Nick Froggatt from England, who defeated Osku Palermaa from Finland 441-423 in the two games final.

Similar to the women's division, the last three years tour winner in the men's division, Paul Moor from England, is the actual runner up in this year's tour and Moor (15 points in Ankara) lost another 25 points to leading Osku Palermaa (40 points in Ankara). The actual standing is 657 points to Palermaa and 597 points to Moor, a difference of 60 points.

Only one new player entered the top 16 of the men's division, when Jari Ratia from Finland squeezed him selves into a position 16 with 22 points in Ankara.

Tobias Karlsson from Sweden took his second victory in a Norwegian Open, when he defeated Mads Sandbäkken from Norway 223 vs. 209 in the one game final of stop 15 in the European Bowling Tour 2007, the Norwegian Open 2007. Tobias Karlsson from Sweden was also highest at the podium at the Norwegian Open 2006.

By the 50 points awarded in Norway, Tobias Karlsson just managed to enter the top 16 of the men's division of the EBT 2007 at position 16 with 151 points. Also Denmark's Jesper Agerbo entered top 16, while he with 23 points in Norway landed at position 12 in the EBT 2007 so far.

The top of the tour ranking in the men's division remained unchanged with Osku Palermaa from Finland at position 1 with 657 points, Paul Moor from England at position 2 with 597 points and Martin Larsen from Sweden at position 3 with 470 points (12 points in Norway).

Ingunn Öien from Norway continued her series of excellent performances, latest she won the European Champions Cup in Luxembourg in September, when she came as far as the Semi Final in the Norwegian Open 2007. By that she took her first highest ranked women position in a tour stop ever.

No new women entered the top 16 of the women's tour ranking, where we still finds Kirsten Penny from England at position 1 with 568 points, Britt Bröndsted from Denmark at position 2 with 520 points and Ghislaine van der Tol from The Netherlands at position 3 with 461 points (40 points in Norway).

This was, so far, the last appearance of the Norwegian Open in the European Bowling Tour, since the board of the Norwegian Bowling Federation has decided to continue the tournament in the coming years, but outside the tour. We want to thank the Norwegian Bowling Federation for their contribution to the European Bowling Tour. The Norwegian Open was adopted in the European Bowling Tour 4 times in the period 2004-2007.

A minimum prize pool of $40.000 \in \text{will}$ be provided (20.000 $\in \text{for each gender}$) and no player taking part will win less than $500 \in \text{.}$

The ETBF Presidium has decided to adjust the tie rules in the EBT 2008 Rules as follows:

Article 22.1 (before)

Squads and final stages where a total of a multiple number of games is counting:

Article 22.1 (adjusted)

Squads and final stages, except head to head matches, where a total of a multiple number of games is counting:

Article 22.3.a (before)

In case of a tie in a game, a one ball roll off on a full set of pins will be played, repeated until the tie is broken.

Article 22.3.a (adjusted)

The final result of a head to head match can be based either on number of games won, or on the total pin fall of multiple games. In case of a tie in a game when the number of games won count, or a tie in a match when total pin fall counts, a one ball roll off on a full set of pins will be played, repeated until the tie is broken.

As the previous articles were written, the highest last game / highest second last game etc. principle was deciding a tie even in a head to head match over for instance two games total pin fall. As a consequence we have seen a final in a tour stop, where the winner of a tied two games total pin fall match was found by comparing the last games of the final.

In the future the highest last game / highest second last game etc. principle still will be in effect for ties in all kinds of competition where a multiple number of players are competing in for instance a qualification round or in final steps with many participants in the same pool, but ties in head to head matches will as of 2008 always be broken by a roll off shot, no matter the format of the match.

A record was broken in Vienna when the organizer Wolfgang Lohschmid, for the first time since the tournament was conducted for the first time since 2003, could see his tournament attract more than 300 players, more precisely 312 players; the thirds highest number in a tour stop in 2007.

The tournament, which was conducted as the 16th stop in the European Bowling Tour 2007 under the name Columbia 300 Vienna Open, was won by Dennis Eklund from Sweden 235-199 against Yoan Alix from France in the one game final on Sunday 21 October in famous Plus Halle.

In the top battle of the women's tour ranking Kirsten Penny from England increased the point gap to Britt Bröndsted from Denmark with 10 points, while Penny was awarded 70 points in Vienna (now at 638 points after 16 stops) and Bröndsted 60 points in Vienna (now at 580 points after 16 stops).

Far most of the top ranked women attended the tournament in Vienna, no new players entered top 16 and not less than 14 of these 16 players was awarded points in Vienna.

In the absence of the two players in front of the men's tour division, Osku Palermaa from Finland (657 points) and Paul Moor from England (597 points), nothing changed in the top of the ranking.

The winner of the tournament Dennis Eklund (100 points in Vienna) entered top 16 at position 13 with 183 points, the same did Dominic Barrett from England (30 points in Vienna) at position 14 with 176 points and Jimmy Dan Mortensen from Denmark (70 points in Vienna) at position 15 with 171 points.
